

Literacy - This half term we will be looking at superheroes. We will spend time looking at real life superheroes as well as people the children look up to as their heroes. Children will create their own comic strip and write a superhero story inspired by comics we will read together.



Numeracy - This half term we will continue looking at multiplication before moving on to division. Children will look at all times tables up until 12x and will look at formal written methods to multiply. They will then use this knowledge to help them divide.

Year 3 Spring 1

Science - We will be exploring light and looking the difference between a light source and a reflection. We will investigate reflective material and play games with mirrors to secure understanding. Children will investigate how light travels and the meaning of opaque, translucent and transparent. We will end the topic by creating a superhero story using shadows and puppets.

PE - Led by Aylestone teachers, children will practice their teamwork and ball control skills in hockey with Mr Handley. With Miss Collier children will be working on their flexibility in gymnastics.

RE - In this subject we will be looking at global citizenship. In particular, the role of the ocean and what we can do to protect it. We will be also be looking at the impact of bottled water and the lack of water in some

Topic - Superheroes of the past

Geography - Children will start off by looking at London during 1666, the Great Fire of London, and comparing it to London now. They will then look further afield and explore oceans and the Arctic. Children will end the topic by creating their own superhero base.

History - For this part of the topic we will look at a range of 'superheroes' from the past including William Wilberforce, Samuel Peypys and Amelia Earhart. We will look at the significant contributions these people have made to how we live our lives today.
